Emerging from two very difficult years, the 2022-2023 season marked our return to normalcy both on and off the piste; it was exciting to see fencers, coaches, officials, volunteers and parents back in force.

With the return to both training and competition, Manitoba fencers quickly showed that the incredible resilience and adaptability honed over the pandemic translated into performance. The entire Manitoba fencing community should be very proud of your collective efforts to realize these results.

This season was packed full of provincial, national and international performance highlights. Six Manitoba fencers competed at the 2023 Canada Winter Games in Charlottetown, PEI, brining home two bronze and one silver medal. From regional, national, zonal and world stages, our fencers did an outstanding job representing our province and Canada at events like Inter-Provincial Cups, National Championships, Junior Pan Ams, and World Championships.

In addition to our athlete performances, our recovery of membership was exciting to see with our end of season registration over prepandemic levels. While fencers train and compete at all levels of fencing, the MFA remains focused on sport delivery at all levels in a safe, inclusive, and fun environment.

As always, we thank each of you: club boards and administrators, club coaches, athletes, and officials for your ongoing commitment to the fencing community and to your support of Manitoba fencers.

#### A Year in Review

The 2022-2023 fencing season was a welcomed return to unrestricted training, competition, and activity giving opportunity to execute initiatives under our general strategy. The strategic directions that were followed:

- 1. Increase exposure to fencing
- 2. Provide programs, services and support to maximize all aspects of fencing in Manitoba
- 3. Create growth opportunities

#### Increase exposure to fencing. Key achievements:

• **Outreach -** 1,500 youth tried fencing through 29 programs, demos, camps, or other events.

#### **Program partners:**

City of Winnipeg, Winnipeg Newcomers Sports Association (WNSA), Municipalities of Ritchot and II De Cheyne, U of M Minu-University, various Winnipeg schools and community centres.

# Provide programs, services, and support to maximize all aspects of fencing in Manitoba. Key achievements:

- Worked with clubs to lift COVID-19 restrictions, allowing for a progressive return to "normal operations" in practice as well as for competition in early/mid 2022
- Increase in general membership and competition participant numbers to over pre-pandemic figures, which is a positive and leading metric for 2022-2023 season
- Increase in efficiency when running scheduled provincial competitions
- 2023 Canada Winter Games were a great success for Team Manitoba fencers, both for individual athlete's performances as well as the overall team experience. We were able to bring back almost 1/6<sup>th</sup> of Manitoba's medals
- Administrative support provided to Canada Winter Games and provincial team athletes in preparation of and travelling to out-of-province competitions
- 2 youth and pizza competitions- low stress, fun introductions to tournaments which were our best-attended events
- 10 week all girls class conducted in French
- 20 week wheelchair fencing program
- Partnered with Fencing Alberta to host advanced Directoire Technique and Referee clinics
- Conducted a pay scale review for tournament officials

## Create Growth and Life-long opportunities. Key achievements:

- Obtained grant for Master Coach-in-Residence Program to train and develop Manitoba Coaches - \$2500
- Trained and integrated third assistant provincial coach into provincial team training, offering increased service and individual lessons. This also benefits club development and quality of outreach programs.
- Continued development of assistant provincial coaches
- MFA provided over 45 paid opportunities for coaches
- Obtained grant for recruitment, retention, and program development for Wheelchair Fencing; co-submitted with Manitoba Wheelchair Sports Association- \$13,000
- Certified 9 Armourers, 3 Directoire Technique (DT) officials, and 4 referees to improve tournament delivery
- Assisted with the certification of 2 national (N) level referees


# Membership
