- Since 2018, Sport Canada has required NSOs to establish an independent third-party mechanism.
- As of 2022, NSOs must use the Abuse-Free Sport process.
- The Office of the Sport Integrity Commissioner (OSIC) is responsible for administering the *Universal Code of Conduct to Prevent and Address Maltreatment in Sport* (UCCMS).


• The UCCMS sets out harmonized rules designed to help advance a respectful sport culture.

Includes:

- standard definitions of maltreatment, including grooming, neglect, and physical, sexual, and psychological abuse
- other prohibited behaviour such as retaliation, failure to report maltreatment, intentionally filing false allegations, misuse of power
- •framework for determining appropriate sanctions

- •Provincial and Territorial governments have committed to implementing independent third-party processes by the end of 2023.
 - Quebec 'Je porte plainte' platform
 - New Brunswick Safe Sport Dispute Resolution Program
 - Nova Scotia Abuse-Free Sport


- Each Program Signatory identifies "UCCMS Participants"
 - Only individuals subject to the complaint process under OSIC
 - OSIC mechanism in Nova Scotia will be limited to individuals 19 years old and above












- Athletes experience psychological abuse and neglect to a far greater extent than other forms
- Neglectful and psychologically harmful behaviours such as demeaning, threatening or humiliating comments, denying basic needs such as food, water, and safe training conditions, have been accepted as <u>normal practices</u> in sport

- Ensuring physical, psychological and emotional safety.
- This includes concussion and injury prevention and creating environments free from bullying, abuse, harassment, discrimination and other forms of maltreatment.


- Safe Sport is NOT about:
 - •Qualifying for a competition or being selected to a team
 - Uneven playing time
 - Disagreeing with an official's ruling
 - Not liking a coach, official, opponent, or administrator
 - Appropriate consequences for not following rules, curfew, or team expectations


Safe Sport is not the absence of 'bad'. It is the presence of 'good'.






- ODo we have the right structures and processes in place to address:

 - They set out rules [policies] but they are incomplete, vague or contradictory
 - They set out rules [policies] but then choose not to follow them
 - They have rules [policies] that do not "fit" with their culture or their resources
 - Fail to review policies
